Definitions

Construction

 building, altering, repairing, installing or demolishing in the ordinary course of business



 a person performing construction through a contract with an owner















Owner

 a person, local public body or state agency other than the department of transportation

Person

 an individual, corporation, business trust, estate, trust, partnership, limited liability company, association, joint venture or similar legal entity


















Payments

 Payments must be paid within 21 days after owner receives undisputed request for payment



 Interest will be computed at 1-1/2% per month or fraction of a month and paid to contractor beginning on the 22nd day after payment was due until payment is issued.















Prompt Pay for All Tiers

 Contractors and subcontractors must make prompt payment to their subs and suppliers within 7 days after receipt of payment from the owner, contractor or subcontractor

 Interest of 1-1/2% will be computed at 1-1/2% per month or fraction of a month beginning on the 8th day after payment was due until payment is issued.















Extended Payment Provision

 Payments by local public body may be made within 45 days after submission of undisputed request when grant money is a source of funding















Amendments to Statute

 Does not apply to construction contracts for residential property containing four or fewer dwelling units.

Changed from Retainage Act in 2007

 Owner, contractor, or subcontractor cannot retain or withhold in any manner payment owed for work performed
